## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### GENERAL

The financial statements have been drawn up in Euros and are for fiscal year 2011.

The foundation was established on May 18, 1999. Women on Waves mission is to empower women to exercise their human right to physical and mental autonomy and to make conscious well-informed decisions, to provide information about safe self-administration of medical abortion, to improve women's reproductive health, to reduce the mortality caused by unsafe abortions, to create public awareness about the consequences of unsafe and illegal abortions and to catalyze support for the legalization of abortion. Women on Waves accomplishes this by combining sexual education and healthcare services and advocacy with a ship on "the waves", through the internet on "the web" and by providing technical support and training to grassroots organisations worldwide.

Some activities were ended in 2011, such as the medical abortion awareness campaigns in Guatemala, Tanzania and DR Congo. During this year Women on Waves continued to work on existing projects and activities including involvement with the Women on Web (access to medical abortion) project, including continuing scientific research and preparing new publications about Women on Web. Women on Waves collaborated with Women on Web in the development of new activities and campaigns such as the support for safe abortion hotlines in Indonesia, Venezuela and community trainings in Uganda, Malawi and Kenya, Africa. Women on Waves also participated in several international conferences and meetings and gave workshops to women's groups about self-administration of Misoprostol to induce an abortion.

The deficit of 17.402 Euros was balanced with the reserve funds of Women on Waves. The deficit was caused by overspending for the hotline campaigns in Indonesia and Pakistan, unexpected expenses for the mobile treatment room, and the launch of the hotlines in Chile and Venezuela.

#### **RELATED PARTIES**

Women on Waves considers Women's Wallet and Women on Web International as related parties due to the close co-operation and relationship with this party.

## ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE VALUATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES AND FOR DETERMINING THE RESULT

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis. Unless otherwise stated, assets and liabilities are valued at the amount at which they were acquired or incurred. Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are listed at the rate of exchange per balance sheet date. Exchange rate results are accounted for in the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures.

The revenues and expenditures are accounted for in the year they relate to, at historical costs. Income from donations is accounted for in the year it is received, except for donations that relate to specific projects. In that case donations are directly matched to the projects.

#### ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE VALUATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

#### Tangible fixed assets

The tangible fixed assets are valued at the purchase cost, less straight-line depreciation based on their anticipated useful economic life.

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#### 6. Salary expenses

The Director is the only paid staff member working for Women on Waves and she divides her time between the different projects. Although she works full time, she is only paid for 1 day a week and donates the remaining time to Women on Waves.

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 For 2011, Rebecca Gomperts and Susan Davies together spent 2% of the total budget on Conferences, 1% on preparations for the campaign in Bangladesh, 2% on the project Diesel for Women, 1% on the medical

abortion awareness in Iraq, 1% on the medical abortion awareness in Argentina, 1% on the medical abortion awareness in Venezuela, 0% on the medical abortion awareness in Chile, 1% on the medical abortion awareness in Surinam, 30% on the medical abortion awareness campaign in Kenya, 1% on the medical abortion awareness and hotline campaign in Pakistan, 55% for the preparations of the Misoprostol training and hotline campaign in Indonesia and Sri Lanka, 1% on the

treatment room in the Netherlands, 2% Women on Web research and 1 % on the organisation of Women on Waves.
