
Beyond Clueless

Ukraine is Not a Brothel

The mandate of Ukraine topless feminist activist organization FEMEN is to fight against the world's perception that Ukrainian women are brides to buy or commodities of sex tourism. Willing to do whatever it takes, even if it means going to jail, FEMEN creates controversy wherever they go. Director Kitty Green explores if FEMEN are strong women fighting the patriarchy left over from their Soviet past, or simply idealistic hypocrites whose naive displays actually work against the cause they're supposedly fighting for?



Self(less) Portrait

Mom and Me director Danic Champoux's latest film finds 50 people revealing some of their most intimate thoughts. Openly baring their souls on screen, the film covers a multitude of subjects that range from funny to heartbreaking. Their candidness creates a diverse portrait of human existence.



Mission Blue

Award-winning filmmakers Robert Nixon and Fisher Stevens, provide an intimate look at legendary oceanographer, marine biologist and botanist Dr. Sylvia Earle. Dedicating her life to exploring the world's oceans, Earle helped to raise awareness of the urgent need for their conservation. The film documents Earle's extraordinary life from her youth to her appointment as Chief Scientist of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to her Mission Blue initiative.



Songs for Alexis

Ryan is an 18 year-old musician who is a bit of an icon in the transgender world (he began his transition from girl to boy four years earlier). However, the parents of his 16 year-old girlfriend, Alexis, disapprove of their relationship. *Songs for Alexis* is a coming-of-age tale that explores how two teenagers are forced to confront the harsh realities of the adult world.
